- **Box Tops for Education.** The more General Mills Box Tops you turn in to St. Paul, the more money the school can earn.
- **Campbell Soup labels.** Tear the label off of your Campbell soup cans and help St. Paul earn points that help them purchase P.E. equipment, even large pieces.
- **Best Choice product labels.** Tear the label off of your Best Choice products to help the school earn money.

- **Plastic Water Bottles.** St. Paul's 6th grade class collects plastic water bottles to recycle in order to earn cash for the Feed the Lambs program.
- **Cell Phones.** Drop off any used cell phone at St. Paul to help the St. Paul school library.
- **Kroger cards.** When using your Kroger shopping card at Kroger, a percentage of your purchase can go to St. Paul's school.
